Batec Compatibility



Batec (meaning Heartbeat in Catalonian) have gone to great lengths to test the compatibility of all chairs they list on the compatibility sheet posted on the web site or available through 49 Bespoke Inc. There are 38 wheelchair manufacturers or

brands on the compatibility list, and a total of 233 individual models tested and approved. There are currently eight in testing and eight non-compatible (this includes those manufacturers that have decided not to approve the use of power add-ons for their particular product or model) for operation with a Batec.

We believe all manufacturers are working hard to ensure their products are built with a safety-first mentality, that they have enough power, enough braking strength, and most importantly that they are powered with CE marked or ISO certification. Lithium batteries used in our Medical Class products have gone through rigorous testing and certifications. We understand those key standards include UN 38.3 for transportation, IEC 62133 for portable applications, and various UL standards (1642, 2054, 2271, 2580) covering different aspects of lithium-ion battery safety. We do not have overcharging issues, short-circuiting, thermal runaway concerns, or other hazards and have a high degree of confidence in ensuring the batteries used are safe for consumers.

Batec has an installation guide and an installation verification sheet that needs to be completed by the certified installer. That sheet of paper produced by the technician not only double checks the validity of the installation but also provides a reference for clarification of future changes, etc. At the end of the day though, it is every end user's responsibility to check their equipment each and every ride. Like an airline pilot, walk around the unit and check for any nut, bolt, or spoke that may be out of place or damaged. Naturally, you want to do that with your chair as

well and make sure the parts and pieces you use have an appropriate speed rating (ie: Schwalbe Marathon Plus and Loopwheels 25 kilometres per hour). Safety is everyone's responsibility! Check out www.Batec-Mobility.com for their latest blog, new team, and all the current product information.

Garett Hickling 1970-2025



One of Canada's most outstanding and decorated Paralympic athletes has passed away. Kelowna native Garett Hickling died recently at the age of 54. Hickling suffered a broken neck in 1987 at the age of 16. Following his accident, he took to the sport of wheelchair rugby.

The Canadian Paralympic Committee described Hickling as a trailblazer in the sport, "an influential leader on and off the court, and one of the best to ever play the game." He represented Canada at five Paralympic Games, winning silver in 1996, 2004 and 2012 and bronze in 2008. He was also Canada's flagbearer in the 2012 London Paralympics. Along with his Paralympic success, Hickling also was named MVP at the first three world championships in 1995, 98 and 2002 leading Canada to silver, bronze and gold medals respectively. "Garett is a wheelchair rugby legend, a true

warrior out there," said former Canadian head coach Patrick Côté to Wheelchair Rugby Canada on the occasion of Hickling's induction to the Canadian Wheelchair Rugby Hall of Fame in 2017. "Being so dominant in a sport for so many years demonstrates how tough he was. Simply put, he was one of the greatest players of all time." His number five has been retired.

Kevin Mills 1981-2025



It was with great sadness that we shared the unexpected passing of Kevin Mills previously. Beloved husband of Heather Cairns-Mills, together for 21 wonderful years, and devoted father to their son, Evan. Cherished son of Kenneth and Barbara,

A celebration of life was held June 7, 2025, and the City of Newmarket presented their highest award to him posthumously July 2m 2025, the Honorary Citizen Award.
