Canada Day 141

On June 20, 1868, a proclamation signed by the Governor General, Lord Monck, called upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout Canada to join in the celebration of the anniversary of the formation of the union of the British North America provinces in a federation under the name of Canada on July 1st. The July 1 holiday was established by statute in 1879, under the name Dominion Day.



After the first anniversary there were special celebrations in 1917 and 1927. Then in 1958 the government arranged an annual observance Canada's national day with the Secretary of State of Canada in charge of the coordination. Canada's Centennial in 1967 highlighted by attendance of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. In 1968 July 1st seen the addition of multicultural and professional concerts held on Parliament Hill including a nationally televised show from National Capital Region. On



October 27, 1982, "Dominion Day" became "Canada Day" and since 1985, Canada Day Committees have been established in each province and territory to plan, organize, and coordinate the Canada Day celebrations locally. Grants are provided by the Department to those committees. This year **Rémi Petitpas**, a 13 year old from New Brunswick (Haute-Aboujagane) used a GPS screen to present his view of "My Canada Today!" It is a special time to be in the National Capital Region on July 1st.

The big day for our friends to the south is on Friday ... **Varilite®**, **Kenda**, **and Ki Mobility** will be closed July 4th for a long weekend.

Szyman, former Secretary General of the International Wheelchair Basketball Federation (IWBF) wrote the following while bestowing on him that federation's highest honor, the Gold Medal Triad! "The words "Hamamoto himself is the history of wheelchair basketball in Japan" repeatedly echo through the wheelchair basketball community in Japan and define Hama Moto's immeasurable contribution to our sport. In 1963, Hamamoto began playing wheelchair basketball, the following year he competed in basketball and athletics at the Tokyo Paralympics. He then began forming teams and introducing wheelchair basketball to the public throughout Japan. By 1975, he established the Japanese Wheelchair Basketball Federation (JWBF) and became its President. By 1983, he had proved instrumental in the introduction of twin basketball in Japan, a sport played by tetraplegics. He played an instrumental role in the formation of the IWBF's Asia/Oceania Zone and served capably as founding President of that federation in 1995."
