70-50-40

What does 70-50-40 mean to the wheelchair sport community across Canada? Well, 2017 is a really big year for the Canadian

Wheelchair Sports Association...

- It's been 70 Years since the first activity in wheelchair sport started at Deer Lodge Rehabilitation Centre in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1947.
- It's been **50 Years** since the Canadian Wheelchair Sports Association was officially incorporated in 1967.
- It's been **40 years** since the Canadian Heritage Sport of 'Murderball,' or Wheelchair Rugby as it's now known, was invented in Winnipeg, Manitoba.



As Canada is celebrating its 150th anniversary, CWSA is celebrating these three milestones in the history of wheelchair sport in Canada to recognize the significant achievements and

contributions of some amazing people who made it all possible: the athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers and partners.

Sacral-Ischial Indent
